

Nemours/Alfred I. duPont Hospital for Children's Emergency Department Nurses Receive National Recognition

ED Nurses recognized with 2019 Lantern Award.

Wilmington, Del.—The Emergency Department nurses at Nemours/Alfred I. duPont Hospital for Children were awarded the prestigious 2019 Lantern Award from the Emergency Nurses Association (ENA). Nemours/Alfred I. duPont Hospital for Children is the only hospital in Delaware, as well as the only pediatric hospital in the Delaware Valley, to have received this national award. Only 28 emergency departments across the country were awarded this year.

The Lantern Award is named in honor of Florence Nightingale, who famously worked to improve and change nursing care in the 19th Century. This award recognizes emergency departments that demonstrate excellent practice and innovative performance through leadership, education, advocacy and research. The Lantern Award has been recognizing Emergency Department nurses since 2011 and each award is valid for three years.

Key Facts

- The Emergency Department nurses at Nemours/Alfred I. duPont Hospital for Children were awarded the 2019 Lantern Award from the Emergency Nurses Association (ENA).
- Nemours duPont Hospital for Children is the only hospital in Delaware, as well as the only pediatric hospital in the Delaware Valley, to have received this national award.
- Nemours duPont Hospital for Children is one of only a handful of emergency departments in the U.S. that is a Level 1 Pediatric Trauma Center, a Level 1 Pediatric Emergency Department (through the EMSC facility recognition program) and a Lantern Award recipient.
- Nemours duPont Hospital for Children is one of only 28 emergency departments out of the over 5,000 emergency departments in the country to receive this award in 2019. Just 8 of the 28 recognized this year are pediatric hospitals.
- The Lantern Award recognizes emergency department nurses who demonstrate excellent practice and innovative performance through leadership, education, advocacy and research.
