

A registered nurse who cares for children with cancer and blood disorders at [Nemours Children's Hospital](#) earned a national honor from the Society of Pediatric Nurses (SPN). Julie Laybourne Swee won the 'Excellence in Clinical Practice' award from the organization. The SPN gives the annual award to a staff nurse who made a significant contribution to the care of children and families through outstanding professional clinical performance.
