They are contributing to the shortage of physicians in Central Florida needed to care for our growing population," said Dr. Heather Fagan, an award-winning medical educator who developed the graduate medical education infrastructure at Nemours Children's Hospital, Florida, accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME).

In July, Nemours Children's Hospital, Florida will also welcome its first ACGME accredited pediatric subspecialty fellows in Emergency Medicine, Hospital Medicine and Endocrinology with other programs in development for accreditation.

The second graduating class at Nemours will be serving children and their families as both general pediatricians and subspecialty fellows. Five residents will be caring for children as general pediatricians and five residents will be entering fellowships in allergy and immunology, infectious disease, pediatric emergency medicine, endocrinology and neonatology. Two residents will serve as chief residents.
