Type 1 Diabetes in the 21st Century: Type 1 diabetes is the most common form of diabetes in youth. Larry Fox, MD, Division Chief of Endocrinology in Jacksonville, will discuss Type 1 diabetes treatment and advancements in care.

Type 2 Diabetes: What's New and What's on the Horizon: Type 2 diabetes could surge nearly 700% in people 20 and younger between now and 2060, according to a recent study in *Diabetes Care*. Pediatric endocrinologist Evan Graber, DO, will review current diagnostic strategies and traditional treatments for type 2 diabetes and discuss newer therapeutic strategies. Dr. Graber will also examine the outlook for pediatric and adolescent type 2 diabetes and explore treatments on the horizon.

HOT CONTROVERSY: Should Younger Children Specialize in One Sport?: According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, children should be encouraged to participate in sports at a level consistent with their abilities and interests. Pushing children beyond these limits is discouraged as is specialization in a single sport before age 12. Brian Daniels, MD, Sports Medicine Physician, will debate this topic alongside other leaders in the field.
