He has recently conducted community-engaged research to develop culturally appropriate approaches to improving COVID-19 vaccine uptake, resulting in several publications on disparities and ways to mitigate them. As an advocate, Dr. Miller is the Vice President of the Delaware Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics and has collaborated with the state's Vaccines for Children program to improve processes for pediatricians.

"I am truly honored to be included among this elite group," Dr. Miller said. "Vaccines have proven to be among the most important public health interventions we have, so advocacy, research and clinical strategies to improve immunization are crucial for the health and well-being of all children."
