Dr. McLendon, based in Jacksonville, Florida, is currently the only pediatric MS provider in the state of Florida and will be extending her network of care as a new partner of the MS Society. To be considered for this partnership, Dr. McLendon went through a rigorous review process where a committee of peers vetted her knowledge and expertise. Dr. McLendon exceeded the qualifications in having at least two years of clinical experience, an evidence-based care practice and at least 20% of the patients are diagnosed with MS and/or other chronic neurologic illnesses, among other criteria.

"I am honored to be named a Partner in MS Care by the NMSS. This collaboration is a positive move forward in continuing to provide prestigious pediatric care for MS. It allows us to connect our patients and their families with additional resources and support, making Nemours a great place for treatment," said Dr. McLendon.

Dr. McLendon joined Nemours Children's in October 2022 after completing a Pediatric Multiple Sclerosis and Related Neuro-Inflammatory Disorders fellowship at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. She completed a five-year residency, first at UF Health Jacksonville and then at the Mayo Clinic in Jacksonville. Dr. McLendon earned her Bachelor of Science in Biology, Summa Cum Laude, from Florida A&M University (FAMU) and her Doctor of Medicine degree from Indiana University School of Medicine (IUSM). She has published several peer-reviewed medical journal articles and is an active researcher.

Dr. McLendon is a member of the Child Neurology Society, American Academy of Neurology, and Consortium of Multiple Sclerosis Centers, among other local professional organizations. Her expertise in neurology is vast, and includes expertise in pediatric multiple sclerosis, myelin oligodendrocyte glycoprotein antibody-associated disease (MOGAD), neuromyelitis optica spectrum disorder (NMOSD), and acute disseminated encephalomyelitis (ADEM).
