As a boy, Dr. Yalcin would go with his father, a surgeon, to visit patients at the hospital. The respect that a doctor commanded made an impression on him, and in his practice treating children, he enjoys interacting with patients and families.



"As doctors, we want to be able to help people, and children with health problems need our help the most," said Dr. Yalcin. "Some are afraid of doctors, but when you can gain their trust and make them smile, it is priceless."

At Nemours, Dr. Yalcin has been impressed with the use of technology in the cath lab where diagnostic imaging equipment is used to treat heart abnormalities and can help patients avoid surgery. This also leads to faster healing, said Dr. Yalcin.

Nemours' aspirations to improve the health of all children helped draw Dr. Yalcin to relocate to the United States with his wife. They will reside in Laureate Park. The Yalcins have two sons, one of whom is in medical school at Yale University, where he is doing neurological research. Another is finishing school in Istanbul.
