

WILMINGTON, Del. (October 1, 2021) – Nemours Children’s Health orthopedic surgeon, Suken A. Shah, MD, was one of 15 healthcare professionals to be elected to the 2021-2022 Scoliosis Research Society (SRS) Board of Directors, a non-profit and professional organization of physicians and allied health personnel focused on supporting research in spinal deformities. The announcement was made on Sept. 25, during the 56th Annual SRS Meeting in St. Louis, Missouri. He will continue to serve as the Education Council Chair.

In addition to his role as division chief, as Clinical Fellowship Director for the orthopedics department at Nemours Children’s, Dr. Shah trains residents, fellows, and visiting observers in advanced spinal deformity correction techniques.

Dr. Shah’s research has been published in more than 200 peer-reviewed journal articles, he’s written numerous book chapters and has reviewed content for various medical journals.
