Modeled after Points of Light's national program, The Civic 50 Greater Philadelphia provides a standard for corporate citizenship and showcases how employers use their time, skills and resources to drive social impact in their communities and company.

The Civic 50 Greater Philadelphia honorees are private and public companies and other employers operating in the Philadelphia region. They have been selected based on four dimensions of their community engagement program:

- Investment of resources
- Integration across business functions
- Institutionalization through policies and system
- Impact measurement

Nemours' Community Engagement Program in the Greater Philadelphia region collaborates and strategically aligns with organizations in the region to achieve a greater impact in the community through shared philanthropic interests. We provide resources and tools to the community to increase knowledge about pediatric health to decrease health disparities.

Despite a worldwide pandemic in 2020, Nemours remained steadfast in its commitment to support the community. Among our organization's many initiatives:

- Nemours Associates dedicated nearly 9000 hours to helping their community
- During our annual Nemours Cares Week, Nemours Associates donated enough items and money to provide 6450 meals to communities in need.
- The Nemours Do Gooders Program, which helps bring a child's civic project to life, launched with two successful initiatives.
- In partnership with multiple community organizations, Nemours executed three community flu clinics across Delaware, vaccinating 117 people, distributing 700 COVID cleaning kits, and 23-thousand pounds of food.
