WILMINGTON, Del. (April 12, 2023) -- The shooting April 8 at Christiana Mall in Newark, Delaware, was a tragic event and a reminder about the prevalence of gun violence in our communities. Gun violence is quickly becoming the <u>number one killer of children</u> and teens in America.

Nemours Children's Health is committed to gun safety, which is why this year we joined other leading health providers across Delaware, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania, as part of the "It Doesn't Kill to Ask," campaign focused on providing caregivers, parents, and community members with tools and resources to speak up about safe gun storage.
