This new state-funded School-based Health Center is a new partnership that builds upon Nemours Children's existing elementary SBHC with the Colonial School District in New Castle, Delaware. As part of a program with the Delaware Department of Health and Social Services, Division of Public Health, the initiative seeks to assist elementaryaged children.

The state of Delaware is seeking to expand SBHC services to high-needs elementary schools, schools that have 90% of its students classified as low-income, English learners, or minority. SBHCs are not a replacement for a student's medical provider but serve as a vehicle for access. Nemours will invest in opening additional centers over the next two years. These services are vital for families in circumstances where leaving work is particularly challenging due to transportation or other demands.
