Once-in-a-lifetime experiences for dozens of local children battling cancer including a ceremonial Go Gold Home Run and Lineup of Courage; Plus, members of the Phillies family who have been personally impacted by childhood cancer show their support to the cause

WILMINGTON, Del. (Aug. 29, 2024) In an effort to raise awareness for childhood cancer, the Phillies are hosting their eighth annual <u>Childhood Cancer Awareness Night</u> presented by Nemours Children's Health on Sunday, September 1, before the 7:10 p.m. nationally televised ESPN game against the Atlanta Braves. The special on-field ceremony will begin at 6:35 p.m. and feature heartwarming moments and once-in-a-lifetime experiences for families affected by cancer.

Participants include those who are receiving treatment from <u>Nemours Children's Hospital</u>, Delaware, as well as those affiliated with the <u>Kisses for Kyle Foundation</u>, which assists families in the Delaware Valley region who are battling childhood cancer with a variety of programs, services and special events.

Members of the Phillies family who have personally been impacted by childhood cancer will take part in the night including second baseman Bryson Stott, who lost his best friend, Cooper Ricciardi, to cancer; infielder Weston Wilson, whose brother, Spencer, has twice overcome a rare tissue cancer; shortstop Trea Turner, a long-time supporter of the V Foundation for Cancer Research; assistant general manager Ned Rice, whose daughter, Wynnie, is battling cancer; and batboy Adam Crognale, a lymphoma survivor who is an advocate for kids with cancer.

Players will also wear <u>Corey's Promise</u> T-shirts during batting practice in honor of Corey Phelan, a Phillies minor league pitcher who lost his battle to cancer two years ago at the age of 20.

In addition, that evening's Phillies Charities, Inc. 50/50 Drawing will benefit the Nemours Foundation. Plus, players and onfield personnel will wear gold ribbons and wristbands to support the cause. Also, children 14 and under will receive Phillies Gold Wristbands, along with a Phillies Go Gold print for all fans, at the entrance gates.
