- The Newborn Screening Program is intended to identify newborn babies with one of a number of rare disorders. Babies with these disorders may appear well at birth. - Every newborn baby in Delaware gets a heel stick to draw blood that is tested for more than 40 metabolic disorders, including cystic fibrosis, sickle cell disease, and thyroid disease.
