Established in 2003, the Beacon Award for Excellence is a national three-year, three-level award. The goldlevel designation, achieved by our PICU, is granted to healthcare units that demonstrate excellent and sustained unit performance and patient outcomes. These criteria are evaluated based on the AACN's six Healthy Work Environment Standards: leadership structures and systems; appropriate staffing and staff engagement; effective communication, knowledge management, learning and development; evidence-based practice and processes; and outcome measurement.
