WHAT: Celebration of National Therapy Animal Day and fundraiser for Nemours Children's Health System. The ADAPT program is offered to eligible current Nemours Children's Health System patients as deemed necessary by the patient's psychologist. They have built a new barn and volunteers bring equine therapists daily for the patients. Patients will see the same equine therapist every visit in order to build a relationship. They are still in the process of certifying the canine therapists, and that service will be offered at a later date.

ADAPT is a first-of-its kind model to incorporate canines (dogs) and equines (ponies) into clinical, therapeutic treatment planning for Nemours patients. Through a partnership with local experts at the University of North Florida Brooks College of Health, Nemours will implement an ADAPT program to benefit today's patients and conduct large-scale studies that contribute to research for the benefit of people, and animals, everywhere.
